Message from Principal: Kerrianne Mills

Hello LGDHS Community,

Welcome to week 6, where the days are getting warmer and the sun is beginning to shine, with only a couple of days until spring.

So much has already happened this term, with dress up days, awareness events, school photos, camps and sports, yet there is so much to come in what seems to be a 'blur' of a year.

Congratulations to our local sporting teams that all made finals this year and the best of luck to those that have made the grand final - how exciting for our town.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that a great healthy lunch and hearty breakfast before school is imperative to your child's learning. We also promote crunch 'n' sip in classrooms, with fruit breaks so please ensure your child's lunchboxes are packed with brain engaging, energising healthy options. We are seeing some students, mostly high schoolers, either not eating their lunches or not bringing lunches, therefore we ask for your support around this, by checking they do so. We also discourage students arriving to school with hot drinks in the morning, especially coffee. As a parent it is your choice as to whether your child can drink coffee or not, but we'd much prefer this stays at home and not be bought to school. We greatly appreciate your support with these matters.

Another friendly reminder to parents in regards to mobile phones. Firstly, if you haven't returned your child's mobile phone policy acknowledgement can you please do so. Whether your child has a phone or not please return your phone with this acknowledgment, we are still receiving reports of students having their phones on them in the school, therefore this is a reminder that we will confiscate any phone and call you to come and collect them from the school. If you know your child brings a phone to school can you please ensure you are returning the mobile policy form stating so and remind your child that they HAVE TO hand it in to the front office each morning. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Last week attendance letters were sent home with some students. These letters were to inform parents only as to where their child/rens attendance (%) is sitting with the Department of Education Attendance records. The letters were sent not as a 'warning' or 'threat' but as a reminder that sometimes we don't realise that just a day off here and there all add up. If we have grave concerns for your child/rens attendance, your classroom teacher or the school administration will be in touch with you directly, the letters are a means of communicating with you each term, a way of monitoring for both the school as well as parents. Attendance figures pre-covid yet, we are continuing to improve as a whole. As stated in the letter if you do not have any outstanding 'unknown' absences then please receive the letter as information only. These letters will become part of the school's attendance procedures to keep families informed and will be issued once a term. Should you have any enquiries about your child/ren's attendance please do not hesitate to contact the school, we will be more than happy to assist in any way we can.

The bookweek parade was a huge success last Tuesday, the students were beyond excited and the atmosphere electric. Seeing all the smiling faces as they walked around the undercover and continuing through the school was a wonderful sight to see. Thank you to all the families who helped put together their child/rens costumes and to those also that managed to attend the parade.



Last Friday we looked at the importance of RUOK day, the student councillors engaged in some teamwork activities and had a discussion around why it is important to check in with our friends.

Why is it important to check in with one another???

In today's world where we are put under so much pressure, we sometimes don't take the time to look after ourselves, by looking after ourselves we can focus on our well-being and happiness, especially during difficult and stressful times, sometimes we don't see what is happening to us until a friend or someone close to us asks how you are doing.

The **RUOK**?? Slogan encourages people to stay connected and have conversations that can help others through difficult times in their lives, it reminds us that we are not alone and that there is support out there, by staying in contact we notice signs that the people we care about are struggling and if we notice a change in their attitude or everyday living we know it is time to trust those signs and ask **RUOK**?? We all go through stuff and sometimes

we try and manage it on our own but having someone you can talk to can make a world of difference, the effects the **RUOK DAY** slogan has made is that there is a significant increase in knowledge around Mental Health and support, and it is OK to not

be Ok, but to make sure you talk to someone if you are not OK, by checking in with each other we decrease the stigma associated around Mental Health, because we want everyone to know they can ask for help... if you feel you can't talk to someone close to you please make sure to call any of these numbers...
