Uniform update: It has been raised with the administration team that the secondary students don't really have a warm enough jumper to wear to school. Those students fortunate to have a Canberra jacket have been wearing these on our recent chilly days. At the School Board meeting this week the uniform policy was discussed to make amendments around the options we have, especially at a secondary student level. It was agreed upon that secondary students can wear their Canberra jackets for this year (2024) only and as of next year they will not be allowed, as per the wearing of previous years leavers jackets, jumpers and shirts. I have discussed with the P&C uniform coordinator what options we have and it has been decided that black polar fleece jumpers will be the winter uniform for secondary students. This will align with our uniform policy and although similar to our primary, still gives our secondary students their individualised identity. Once the new jumpers are organised they will be promoted for your purchase. The P&C are also looking into options for 'bottoms', this is an reminder that leggings and bike shorts are **NOT** permissible options as uniform and all shorts must be mid-thigh in length.
