



You can even ask family and friends if they would like to order any First Aid Kits and help raise funds for our school.



Message from School Nurse: Laura Ballard

Hello LGDHS Community,

Increasing cases of Pertussis

Cases of Pertussis, which is commonly known as Whooping cough, are increasing around Australia including an increase in cases in WA. The highest number of cases have been seen in the 10-14 year old age group, infants under the age of 6 months are at the greatest risk of severe disease, hospitalisation and death.

Pertussis presents with common cold-like symptoms (cough, runny nose, mild fever, and lethargy) and typically progresses to bouts of sudden and uncontrollable coughing, sometime with post cough vomiting, choking and inspiratory 'whoop'. The cough is often worse at night and may last up to three months. Testing for pertussis can be conducted with your local GP with a nasal swab.

Free vaccines are available for pregnant women, routine childhood and adolescent vaccination under the National Immunisation Program. They are available to others outside this demographic at local GP's. If concerned that you may have Pertussis, is it advised that you stay away from infants and pregnant women until vour test result is known.


Year 5/6 Camp: Term 3


Country Week Recap
