#### **Reports**

### **Contributions and Charges for 2025**



### Contributions & Charges Questions & Answers

Dear Parents/Carers,

To enable us to provide quality education to our students, the School Board has endorsed the collection of Voluntary Contributions and Charges.

School contributions and charges are not compulsory, however parents are encouraged to pay a **Voluntary Parent Contribution** of \$60.00 for Kindergarten to Year 6, and \$235.00 for Years 7-10 towards their child's education. A statement will be sent to you early in 2025, with payment due by 31 March 2025.

Attached to this letter is an information sheet explaining the contribution and additional charge options structure.

The school will continue to provide your child with a high standard of instruction, however some subject areas may need to modify their program due to budget constraints.

#### Will my child be stopped from completing units if the contribution is not paid?

No child will be excluded from taking part in a basic instructional course if the voluntary parental contribution is not paid. However, they may be excluded from undertaking any additional cost options if the additional charge is not paid.

### Will I still be able to get the Secondary Allowance (\$235 in 2024) due to my Health Care / Pension Card?

Yes, the Secondary Allowance Scheme will still be available. This will be provided to the school towards the Education Program Charges in the first instance with remaining funds applied to Voluntary Contributions. The clothing allowance can be sent directly to you or applied to outstanding voluntary contributions.

#### Will I still be able to pay off the Voluntary Parent Contribution over the year?

Yes, the school will be happy to negotiate a time payment plan for you to pay your Voluntary Parent Contribution.

#### Will I still be required to pay for camps, excursions and incursions held during the year?

Yes, if your child wishes to go on any camp, excursion / incursion, they will be required to pay the cost of attending. As a guide to what the costs may be, please check the attached list. A detailed list has been ratified by the School Board and is being sent home to parents with this letter.

#### If my child transfers to another school or leaves school can I get the money back?

If a student transfers to another school, the balance of the Voluntary Parent Contribution will be forwarded to the new school. If a student leaves the school (eg, gets an apprenticeship), any unused portion of the Voluntary Parent Contribution will be refunded to the parent, except where the Secondary Allowance Scheme has paid the contribution - this will not be refunded.


