### **Message from Administration**

Hello Lake Grace District High School Community,

On Thursday of Week 6 the Year 8-10's were visited by The Career

Taster Road Show. It was an incredible opportunity for the students to gain a little insight in to some possible future career options. The students really enjoyed the day and learnt a great deal!

Last week NAPLAN commenced with the help of Mrs Wendy O'Neill and Mrs Desmond. NAPLAN stands for 'The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy' and is a national assessment taken annually in March. Students are assessed in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and mathematics.

NAPLAN is delivered by ACARA (Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority). Each state has a test administration authority who is responsible for the delivery and implementation of NAPLAN in their state. NAPLAN is undertaken for several reasons including public accountability for schools, teachers and students. It is a national assessment to measure a student's skills in literacy and numeracy at the time of the tests. The results of this testing inform the government of each school's ranking against national standards as well as the national standards compared to international standards. Parents can see their child's level compared to the national standards and determine if there are any areas of focus which the student can improve. Results from NAPLAN provide insight into what learning areas students are struggling in and where improvements could be made.

Today Mrs Lisa O'Neill has co-ordinated the students to take part in the Closing the Gap initiative. During period 4, each class went outside to sit in a yarning circle. Classes sat and had discussions, read indigenous books and soaked up the autumn sunshine.

This week is also Harmony Week and Miss Brodie and some students have collaborated to hang the beautifully hand painted Harmony Week Banner in the gazebo. Classes have incorporated Harmony Week themes into some lessons to celebrate Australian multiculturalism.

Good Luck to all the students participating in the faction swimming carnival tomorrow. Thank you to all staff who organised and assisted in co-ordinating on the day. Thank you also to all volunteers helping out tomorrow, the day wouldn't happen without you!

Next week the lucky Year 7 & 10's are getting a visit from Kate Furphy our new school nurse to receive vaccinations. Kate has taken over from Nurse Laura and will be visiting our school to promote a healthy lifestyle.

On Thursday the 3rd April the Highschool Students will partake in an excursion called Illuminate the Day. ### Message from the School Nurse: Kate Furphy

Hello Lake Grace District High School Community,

Gastroenteritis is currently present in town. Gastroenteritis, or 'gastro' is a common condition in children of all ages. It occurs when the bowel is infected by a virus or bacteria. Symptoms include diarrhoea, vomiting, stomach cramps and sometimes, fever.

Most cases in children are not serious, but it is very important to make sure that a child with gastro receives enough fluid.

If your child has gastro, keep them away from school for 48 hours after vomiting and diarrhoea have stopped. If symptoms persist see your family doctor.

The easiest way to prevent gastro is to make sure everyone in the family washes their hands regularly, especially before eating and after going to the toilet.

It has been a busy and exciting start to the year in Year 1/2, with lots of learning and fun! This year, our school has introduced The Resilience Project (TRP), a program designed to build resilience and promote happiness by focusing on emotional literacy and positive emotions.

As part of TRP, we have been engaging in GEM Chats discussions centred around Gratitude, Empathy, and Mindfulness. These conversations help students reflect on their emotions and develop a deeper understanding of their thoughts and feelings.

One of our recent GEM Chat questions was, "What has made you smile today?" Instead of simply naming physical things like "I got a new bike" students are encouraged to think more deeply about moments that bring them joy, whether it's a kind gesture from a friend, a fun activity in class, or a sense of accomplishment in their learning.

We are excited to see our students develop their resilience and emotional awareness through this program and look forward to sharing more of their reflections throughout the year!




