National Science Week


Celebrating the National Science Week 2025 school theme: Decoding the Universe, the education program STEMania! is coming to our school on Tuesday the 12th of August 2025!

The program focuses on how each STEM discipline plays a crucial role in decoding the universe. It will inspire curiosity and a love of learning by showing how STEM is both fun and relevant to our everyday lives.

Students will learn about the wonders of STEM through four fact filled sketches. Throughout, audience members and student volunteers are encouraged to offer suggestions that the actors will incorporate into the action. The result is that students have input into the show while watching it!

This is a 45-minute, live, interactive science sketch comedy performed by professional actor-educators. Primary students will continue to engage in National Science Week through inquiry-based science lessons and activities. These are the themes classes will experience.

PP	Nature Animals - We are learning to make shapes with leaves, twigs and flowers. Students will create an Australian animal art piece.					
1/2	NATURE ART AND OBSERVATIONS - We are learning to observe leaves using our sense of sight. Students will carefully observe the features of leaves gathered from around the school and draw a detailed image just like a botanist scientist.					
2/3	DECODING ANIMAL PRINTS -We are learning to track animals from their prints. Using a tray, cocoa/cornflour, spoon and plastic animals – students play by making prints with toy animals.					
3/4	DECODING ANIMAL PRINTS - students will practice decoding patterns left behind by animals in their natural habitats. By following the prints of kangaroos or other Australian animals, they learn about what animals need to survive.					
5/6	COMMUNICATE WITH LIGHT - We are learning how to use light to communicate. Students are creating their own light code to communicate using torches.
