The Dental van is arriving at the Lake Grace District High School on Friday 29th August. Dental staff will be in attendance on Monday September 1st, in the afternoon and we are operating out of the Corrigin Mobile van. Our phone number and email are as above.

If your child has attended your family Dentist within the last 6 months, please let us know so that another student can have that appointment.

We will be at Lake Grace DHS for approximately 4 weeks. All students who are enrolled with us will receive an appointment letter.

Any new student will have been issued with a Dental enrolment form. If you wish your child to be enrolled with the dental van, please complete the form as soon as possible and place in the reply-paid envelope and place in a post-box so that the form is processed by our CAS team in Perth.

We cannot issue an appointment until your child has been enrolled. Due to the short time, we will be in Lake Grace, we ask kindly if parents could attend for the check up appointment so that any treatment required can be discussed with our staff, and all forms can be completed on the day.

If you are unable to attend, please email the dental van or leave a message/text on our phone. Your child will be issued, at the end of their check-up appointment, with a consent for treatment form and medical form. These forms must be completed and signed as soon as possible and returned to the Dental van or school office.

Please feel free to contact us by phone, email or come to the van to discuss any issues you may have regarding your child's dental care. We look forward to meeting you all again.
